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### 2011 SANTOS TOUR DOWN UNDER JAYCO STAGE 5 LIVE REPORT

<b>22/01/2011 6:20:35 PM</b>	Jayco Stage 5, 2011 Santos Tour Down Under: Stage speed: 42.5kmh. Race time: 3:06:10. Average race speed: 42kmh. 131 riders started the stage, 130 finished with <b>Jose Vicente GARCIA (ESP) - MOVISTAR TEAM</b> abandoning mid-race.
<b>22/01/2011 4:24:34 PM</b>	So while history is against Matt Goss winning, many things to happen in this edition of the Santos Tour Down Under have been rare events, so just maybe another twist in the tale is on the cards when we reconvene tomorrow on the streets of Adelaide.
<b>22/01/2011 4:24:21 PM</b>	That year Stuart O'Grady won an intermediate sprint to claim his 2nd STDU crown by a slender two seconds.
<b>22/01/2011 4:24:04 PM</b>	Santos Tour Down Under history suggests that Meyer will go on to win the race tomorrow in Adelaide as only once, in 2001, has the race lead changed on the final day.
<b>22/01/2011 4:23:54 PM</b>	Luis Leon Sanchez was the winner in 2010, five years after another compatriot by the name of Allberto Contador did likewise.
<b>22/01/2011 4:23:44 PM</b>	Another group of riders—containing Meyer and Greipel then caught the lead-group just before the finish, but the Ventoso timed his run perfectly to pip Matthews and Goss and make it back to back wins (and three in total) for Spanish riders at Willunga.
<b>22/01/2011 4:23:33 PM</b>	On the descent into Willunga 20 riders looked set to contest the finish but Bobridge crashed on the final corner bringing down <b>David LOPEZ (ESP) - MOVISTAR TEAM</b> in the process.
<b>22/01/2011 4:23:23 PM</b>	Again the pace wasn't frighteningly fast but three riders were able to break away. <b>Ben HERMANS (BEL) - TEAM RADIOSHACK</b> , <b>Richie PORTE (AUS) - SAXO BANK - SUNGARD</b> and <b>Jack BOBRIDGE (AUS) - GARMIN-CERVELO</b> were the first over the summit, with Bobridge there simply to make sure no one

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	could get away, as the National road champion aimed to protect team mate's Cameron Meyer's race lead.
<b>22/01/2011 4:23:08 PM</b>	<b>Luke ROBERTS (SA) - UNI SA-AUSTRALIA</b> won the first Skoda KOM points on offer as the race splintered before largely regrouping for the 2nd summit of the now famous climb.
<b>22/01/2011 4:22:54 PM</b>	On the approach to the first climb up the Old Willunga Hill, the break was caught, but when they did hit the hill, the pace was steady rather than furious.
<b>22/01/2011 4:22:43 PM</b>	These riders contested the two Jayco Sprints at Snapper Point---the 1st won by <b>Davide VIGANÒ (ITA) - LEOPARD - TREK</b> from <b>Sebastian HAEDO (AGR) - SAXO BANK - SUNGARD</b> and <b>John MURPHY (USA) - BMC RACING TEAM</b> and the 2nd won by <b>John MURPHY (USA) - BMC RACING TEAM</b> from <b>Davide VIGANÒ (ITA) - LEOPARD - TREK</b> to <b>Juan HORRACH (ESP) - KATUSHA</b> which allowed Viganò to move up the GC.
<b>22/01/2011 4:22:28 PM</b>	Eventually eight riders got away, after five attacked around the five km mark. The numbers in the break were <b>Tanel KANGERT (EST) - ASTANA</b> , <b>Davide VIGANÒ (ITA) - LEOPARD - TREK</b> , <b>Juan HORRACH (ESP) - KATUSHA</b> , <b>Eduard VORGANOV (RUS) - KATUSHA</b> , <b>John MURPHY (USA) - BMC RACING TEAM</b> , <b>Sebastian HAEDO (AGR) - SAXO BANK - SUNGARD</b> , <b>Joost van LEIJEN (NED) - VACANSOLEIL DCM PRO CYCLING TEAM</b> , <b>Michael HEPBURN (QLD) - UNI SA-AUSTRALIA</b> .
<b>22/01/2011 4:22:14 PM</b>	But back to Jayco Stage 5 and with attacks being mounted as soon as the flag dropped it was only a matter of time before the peloton would let a group go.
<b>22/01/2011 4:22:03 PM</b>	If it sounds a long shot, it isn't because Goss is as fast as anyone at the STDU, and he has the strongest team for the sprints. So anything is possible.
<b>22/01/2011 4:21:51 PM</b>	Goss can win the Santos Tour Down Under with a stage win tomorrow but he and his HTC team will have to deny Meyer any time bonuses at the two Jayco Sprints and then also hope Meyer finishes outside the top three on the line.

In 2001, Graeme Brown, Fabio Sacchi, Alessio Galetti, Luke Roberts, and Kai Hundertmark won the opening five stages with David McKenzie winning on the final day to make it six from six. Could that be that something similar tomorrow? Just some of the sprinters not to have won yet at this STDU include McEwen, Greipel, Farrar and Chicci. And if for some reason Goss is out of contention by the finale, you can throw Cavendish's name into the mix too.
